We host pre-event lunches, which allow for more in-depth discussions with both the speaker and key stakeholders within the policy space.

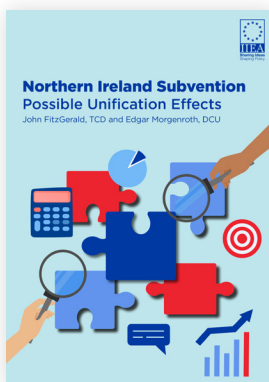
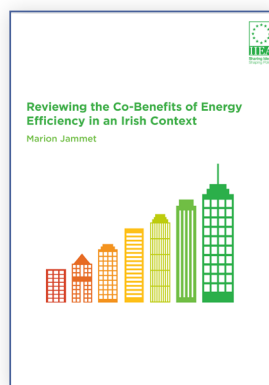


Members have access to our research throughout the year via our weekly Digest and monthly Newsletter. Some of our most recent publications are available below.
